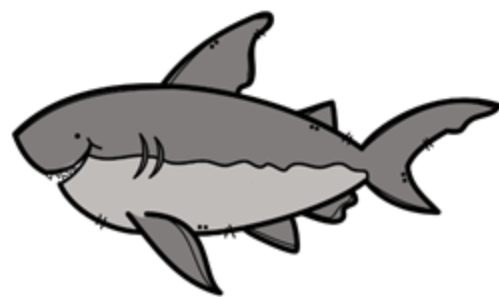
Cut out the shark box with the solid black lines. Use the dashed lines to glue onto the shark to label the parts.

Cut out the large rectangle. Then cut just the solid vertical line and stop before you get to the strip at the top. Place glue on the horizontal strip that says sharks. Lift each flap to write what sharks can, have, and eat.



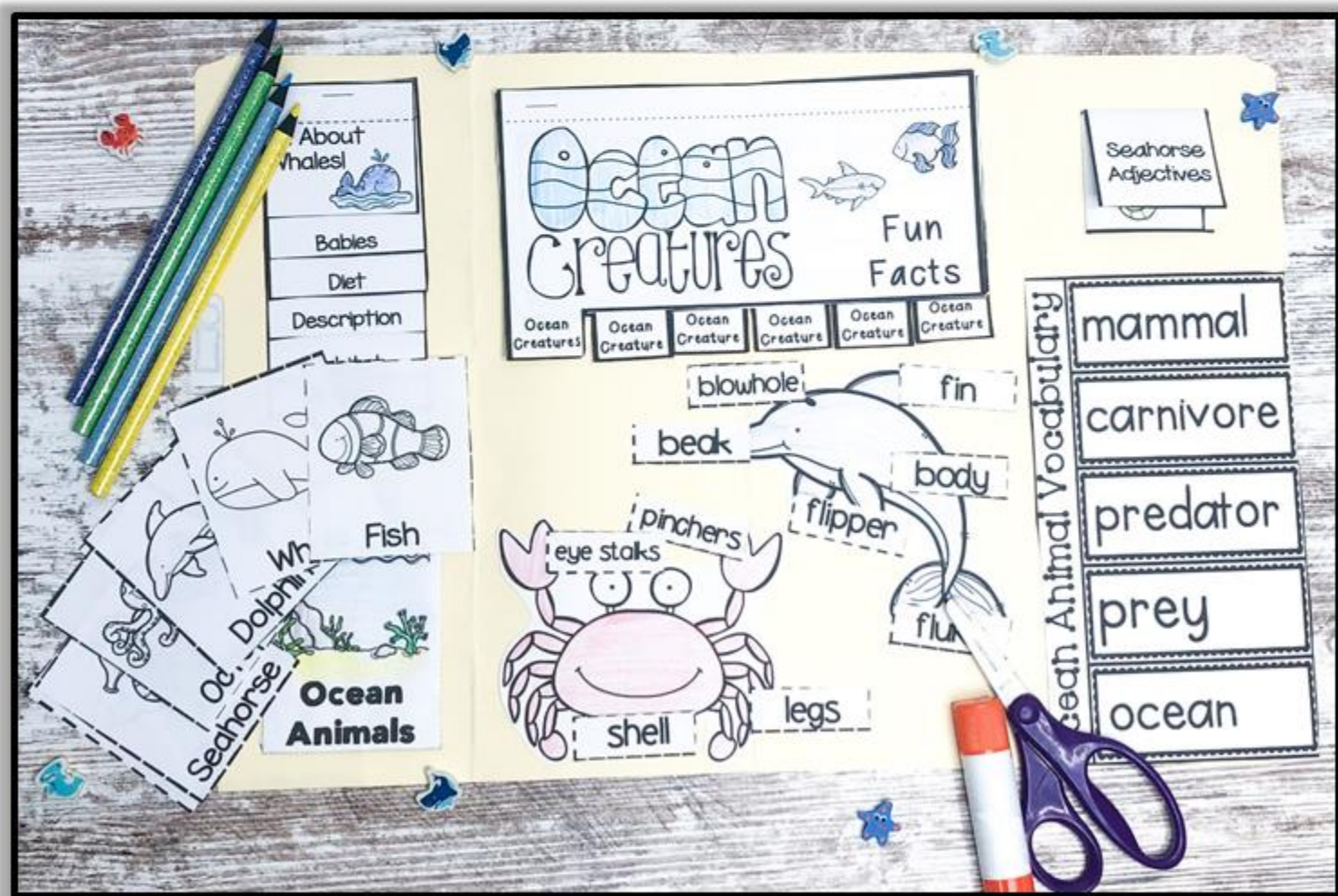

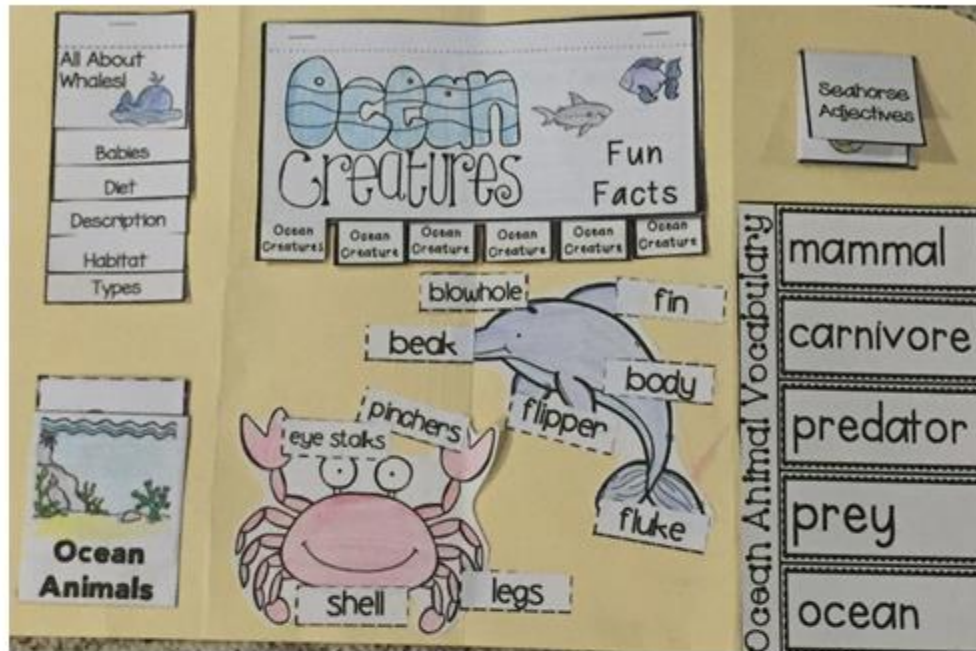


Layout Suggestions

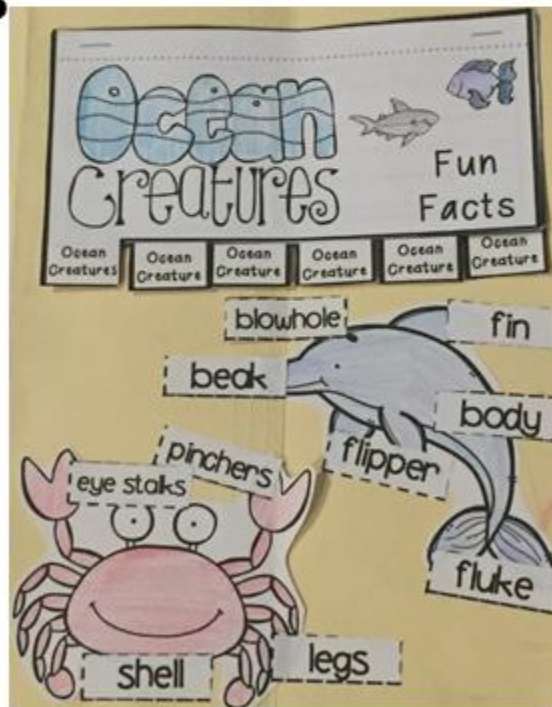
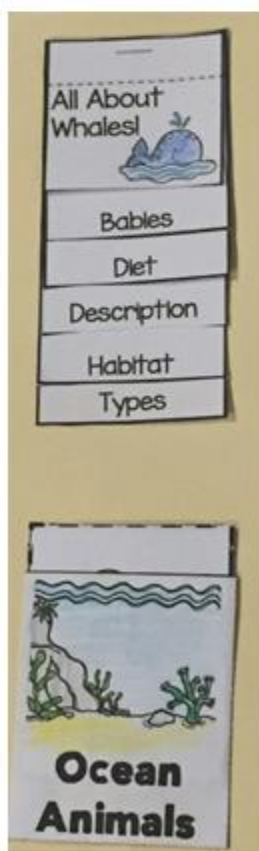
