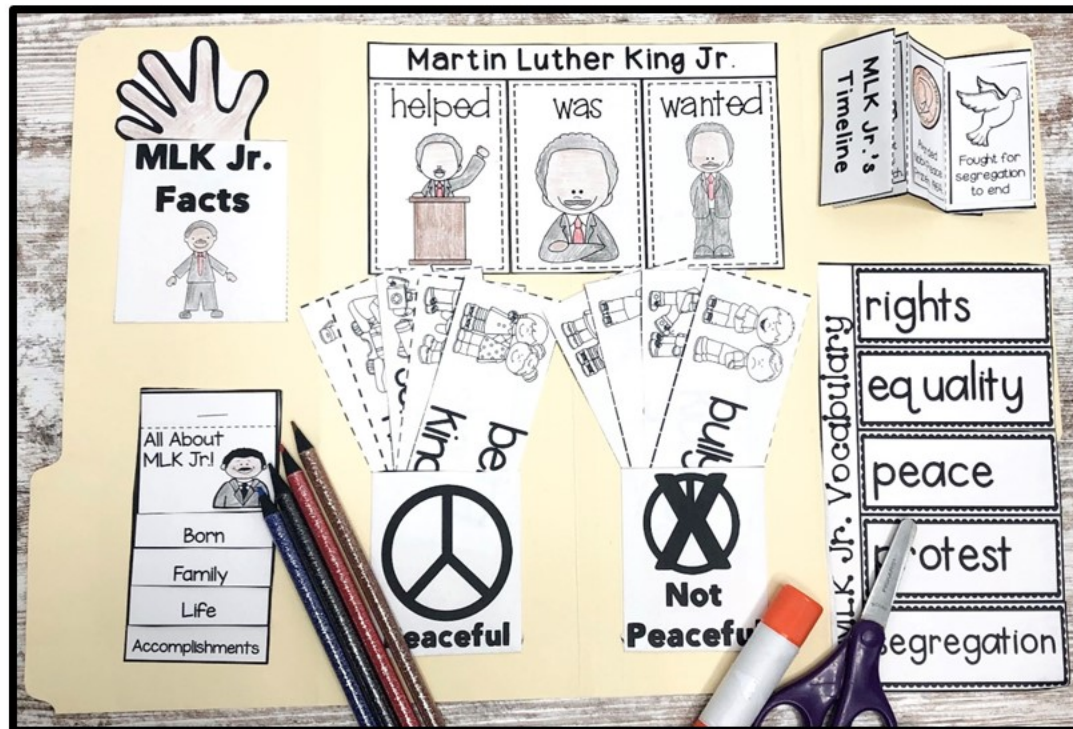
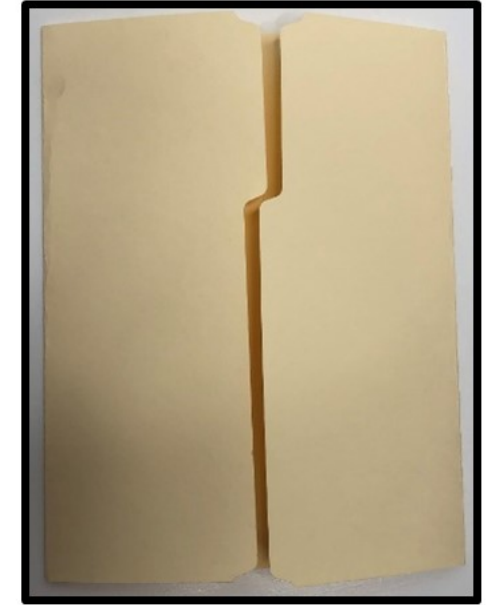




# Teacher Tips

## 1 Prepare Materials

- scissors
- glue
- markers, crayons, or colored pencils
- copies of lapbook pages
- file folder, construction paper, or notebook (fold one side to the middle, then fold the other side to the middle)



## 2 Create Lapbook

- Break the activities up into different days or sessions. I like to do one activity (flap) a day.
- Students will cut & glue each flap to the folder and complete the activity.
- Complete various activities throughout the week to place into folder.
- Decorate the front.
- Bring home to share with families.





Each template has step by step directions to tell you how to cut and fold each flap!

Cut out the long rectangle on the side on just the solid lines. Cut out each individual picture. Glue the pictures in order to show MLK Jr.'s timeline onto the long rectangle strip. Accordion fold the strip on the dotted lines. Place glue just on the "glue here" strip to glue to lapbook.

Cut out the boxes that say Peaceful/Not Peaceful on the solid lines. Cut out each box with a picture. Fold back each flap on the Peaceful/Not Peaceful box that says "glue here." Only place glue on those strips and glue to notebook. This will create a pocket to sort the actions into the correct pocket inside.

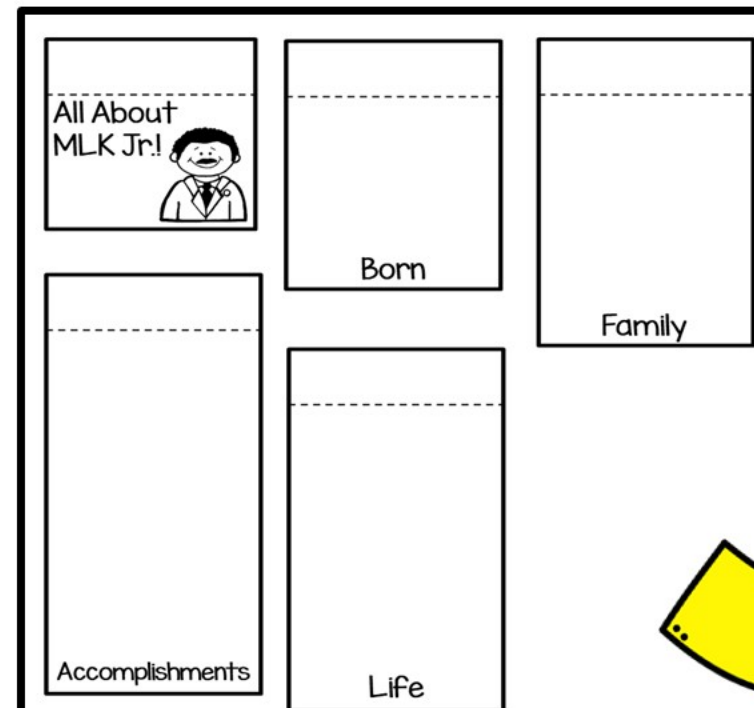

# Easy to Make and Assemble

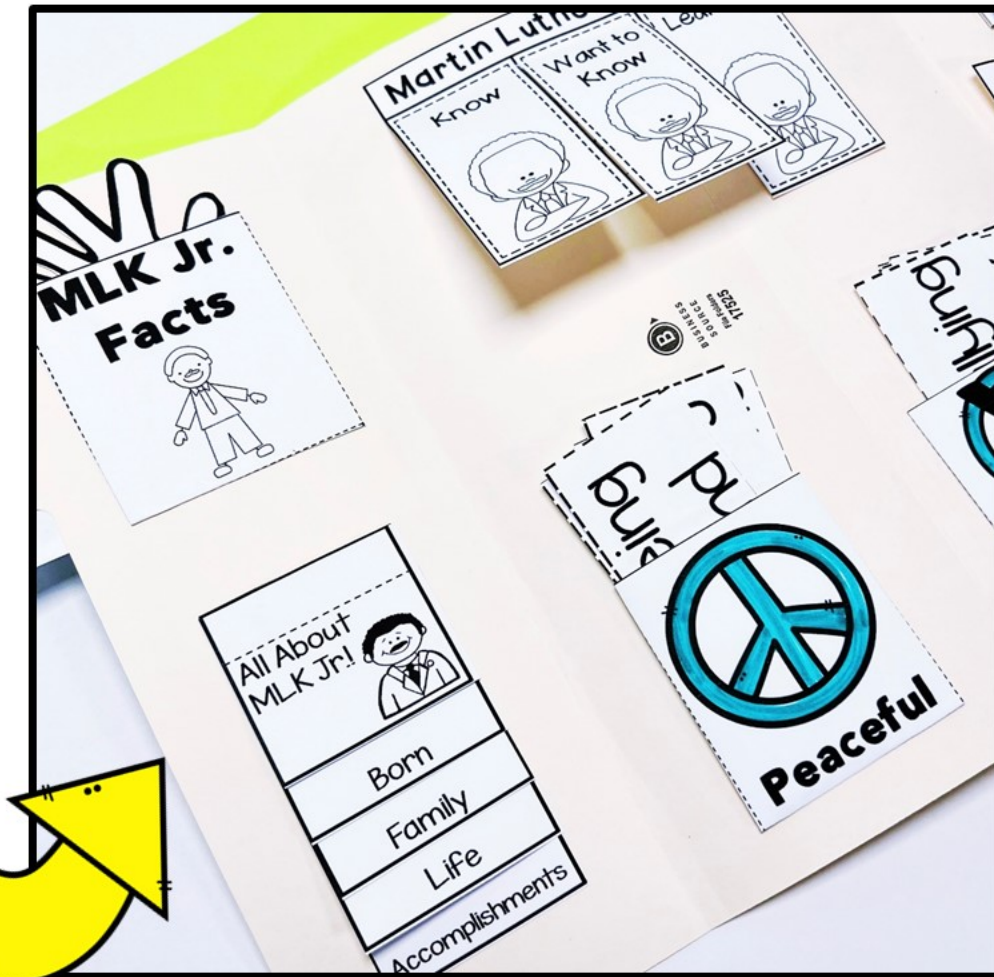
Simply print the templates and let your students complete and create!

These templates go just beyond a worksheet. They become interactive!



Cut out each rectangle on the solid black lines. Stack the pieces in order from shortest to longest to make a flip book. Staple at the top then glue the back page to the notebook. On each page, draw and write about MLK Jr.'s life.

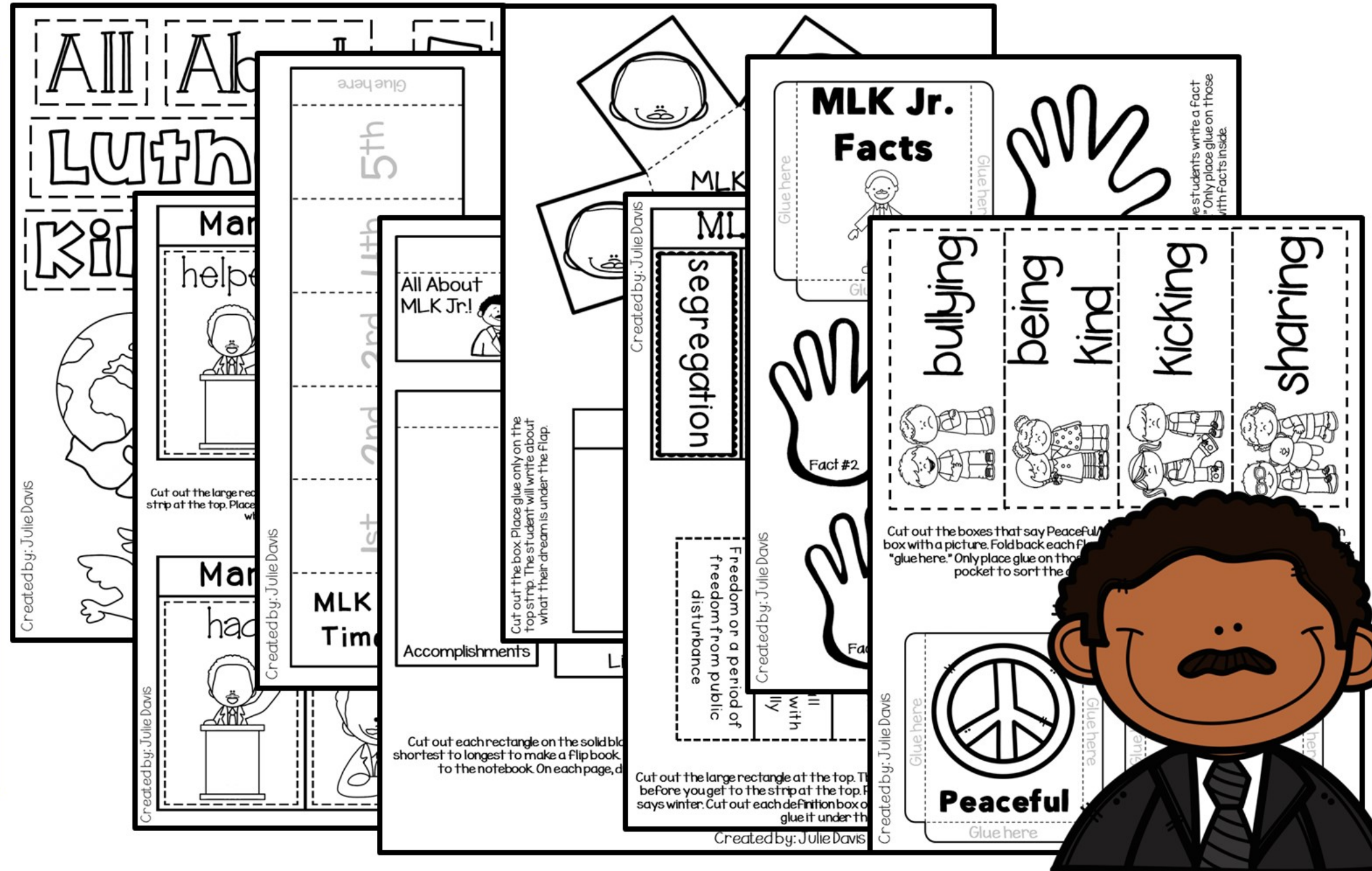
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# Printable Templates

Lots of templates included to use in the lapbook. Pick and choose which ones work best for your students.



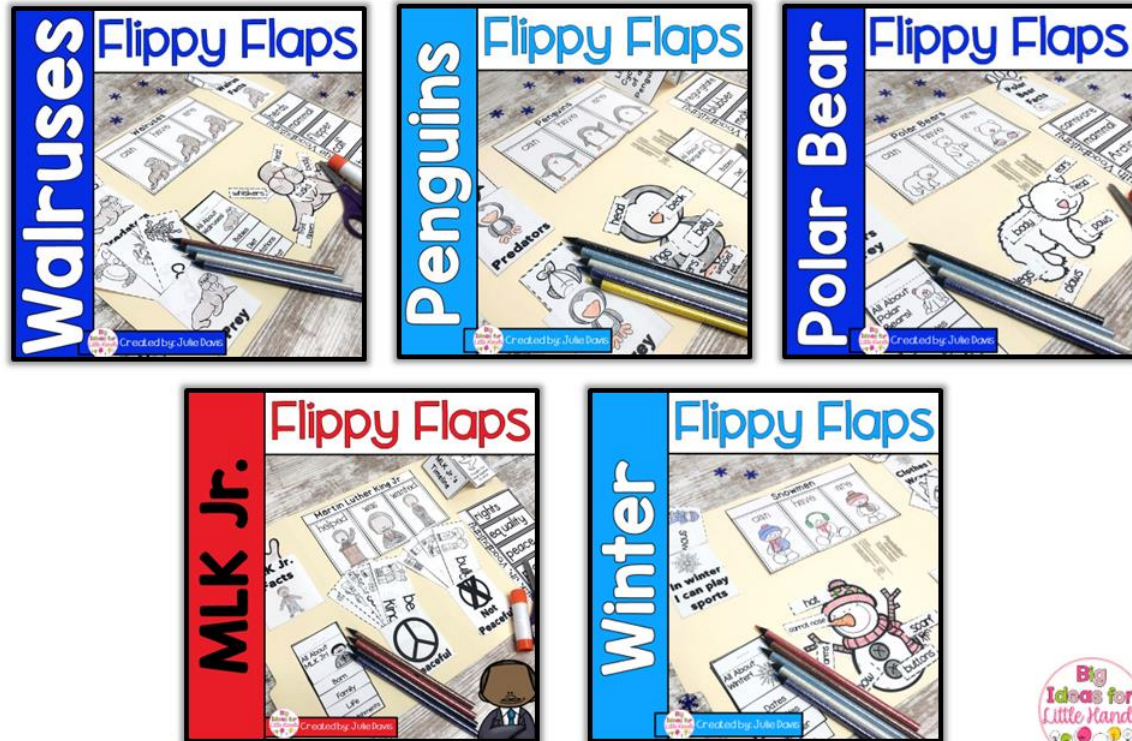
